Ticklish Endings: loquébar pacem de te. lu-cí-fe-rum génu- i te.
in saécu-lum saécu-li. et exaudívit me. *

Gradual & Alleluia Verse

(Ps 27: 7, 1) In God hath my heart confided, and I have been helped; and my flesh hath flourished again; and with my will I will give praise to Him. Vs. Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent; depart not from me.

ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA. (Ps 80: 2-3) Vs. Rejoice in God our helper; sing aloud to the God of Jacob: take a pleasant psalm with the harp. ALLELUIA.
