TARTING IN 2008, Watershed scanned more than 30,000 pages of rare liturgical manuscripts taken from Jeff Ostrowski's personal collection. We continue to offer these for free & instant download. While some are mainly of interest to scholars, others are not. For example, the *Nova Organi Harmonia* contains 3,000 pages of Gregorian organ accompaniments. These accompaniments had immense influence, and have been imitated by large & small publishers of Church music.

TARTING IN 2009, Watershed produced a series of videos about the Sacred Music Colloquium. One film, a 60-minute documentary produced completely "pro bono," is broadcast every summer on EWTN, and has appeared on other networks as well. TARTING IN 2007, Watershed created several websites, and each contains thousands of liturgical scores & practice videos. These include the *Saint Antoine Daniel Kyriale*, the *Saint Charles Garnier Gospel Acclamations*, the *Saint René Goupil Gregorian Tome*, and the *Saint Noël Chabanel Responsorial Psalms*.

TARTING IN 2011, Watershed was asked by the *Church Music Association of America* to produce a series of practice videos for the complete "Simple English Propers" collection. This was done as a service to the Church, without any compensation, and has been very well received.

TARTING IN 2013, we began a Blog called *Views from the Choir Loft*. While you might not agree with everything we say, our contributors are always professional and usually interesting. People from all over have written to us, letting us know what a difference the Blog has made in their Church music career.
