

*Singing of the liturgical texts themselves*—such a direct participation in the liturgy of the day is obviously the ideal. However, the practical difficulties involved in teaching everyone the words, and the unfamiliar musical setting which is often the only thing available for the texts, require that the program be fairly well launched before anything of this sort is attempted.

Whatever the time schedule and order under which the various elements of the program are introduced, the following practical observations will perhaps be useful:

1. There is no need to create too much apprehension concerning the program which is being introduced. The various things it requires of the people are easy enough, and with cooperation and effort, they will be quite familiar and even automatic in a few weeks' or at the most a few months' time.

2. The one thing the program requires above all others, especially during its initial stages, is forceful, enthusiastic leadership. The priest himself should be entirely sure of what it is the parish is about to do, and he should be quite convinced in his own mind that the objectives that can and will be achieved are entirely worth the effort. His enthusiasm and determination should show themselves in the way he is careful to foresee difficulties, quick to spot areas in which performance might be getting sloppy, and patient in bringing up again a prayer or song that was mastered once but is now causing difficulty again. For any program, no matter how well it is introduced, will require constant attention if it is not to lose its meaning and polish.

3. Concerning the singing, it should be noted that metric hymns are ordinarily easier to learn and sing than non-metric ones. Also, any really good hymn will usually have only one or two places in it that will cause any difficulty. These are the places that should be practiced, while only a few lines of the hymn as a whole need be sung before

the people have caught the basic melody. Experience has shown that it is as easy to over-rehearse as it is to under-rehearse, and equally destructive to a program of participation. The priest should realize that even a congregation with several years' experience with a program of participation will not do too well the first time a hymn is introduced. But the actual singing of the hymn at Mass throughout a liturgical season is itself practice, and before too many Sundays have passed the new hymn has become a familiar one.

4. The priests must be very careful to let the people see that the Mass program is not something that he is telling them to do but something they are working out together because it is worthwhile. It is most important that he identify with his people in the efforts they are making, admitting that he too finds much of it strange and a little awkward but adding that he is convinced that the goal to be achieved is worth the common effort.

#### NOTE FOR THE FOLLOWING CHART

The pattern given in this chart is intended for full participation in low Mass on Sundays, feastsdays, and whenever it is possible to achieve this measure of activity. It is entirely flexible and circumstances will determine how much of it is possible at daily Masses when the congregation is limited in numbers.

Although the low Mass (recited, spoken Mass) is considered directly, it is easy to adapt the pattern to sung Mass, in which the people should, generally speaking, sing the parts which they recite at low Mass. At sung Mass there is less flexibility with regard to the proper chants, and the low Mass hymns or other songs (entrance, between the lessons, etc.) are replaced by the liturgical texts appointed for the Mass of the day.
