A THOUGHT FOR SUNDAY

One of the evils of today's society that is never talked about is the replacement of God with other things. People think it's ok to sin, but it's not ok to smoke. Or people who believe in nothing make a religion out of not eating animals.

Being careful not to offend those who cannot eat certain foods for medical reasons, there is a category of person that think it is a sin to eat animals that have feelings.

The question could be asked, that why, if that is wrong, would Our Lord work a miracle of filling two boats with fish? Or why later on did God give a vision to St. Peter to kill and eat from a large variety of animals - both "clean" and "unclean"? (Acts 10)

MAKE A PLEDGE!

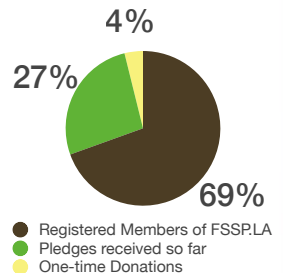
We need a church for our growing community!
