With ev - er joy - ful hearts And bless-èd peace to cheer us;

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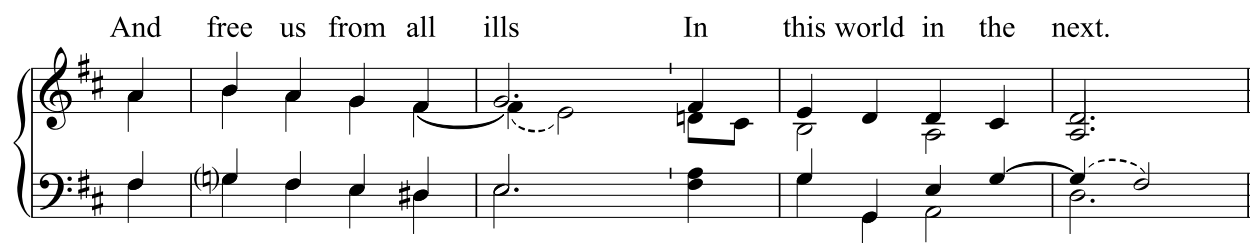
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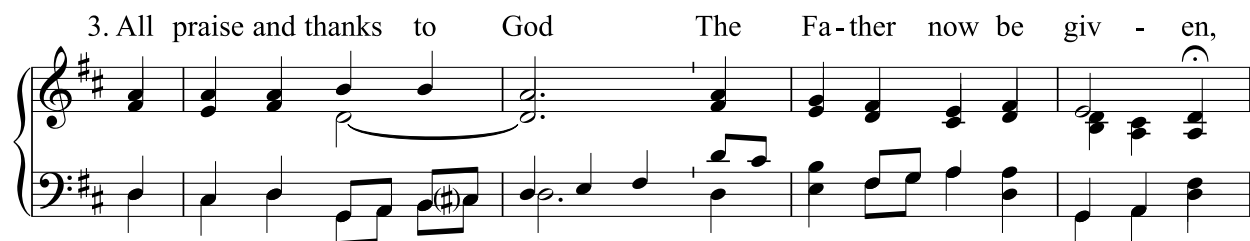
And keep us in His grace, And guide us when per-plexed,



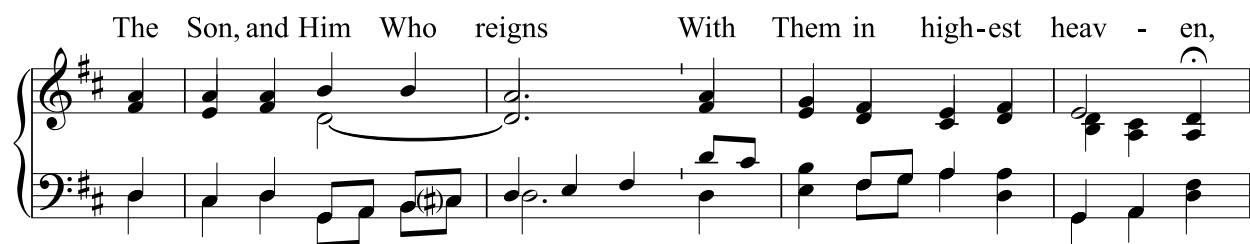

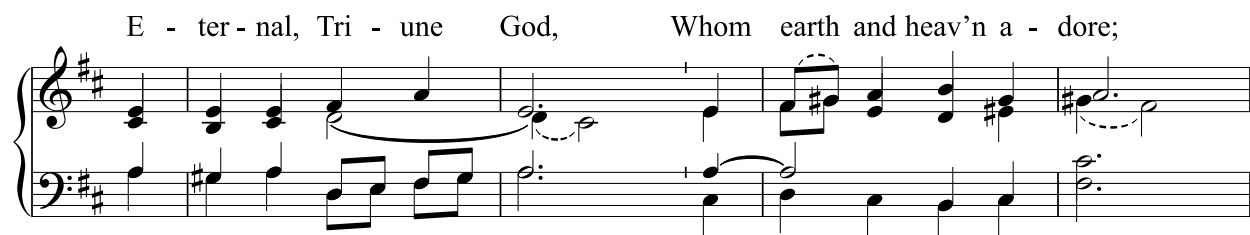
