In 1895, Father Perosi was ordained to the sacred priesthood by his close friend, CARDINAL SARTO (at that time, Patriarch of Venice). Visiting the abbey of Solesmes in July 1894, Perosi found only Dom Mocquereau there, as DOM POTHIER had already left for the Abbey of Ligugé, where he was assigned as claustral prior. While at Solesmes, Perosi received a famous letter from Cardinal Sarto (*who was later elected Pope Pius X*). The cardinal wrote: “I am profoundly happy that you have arrived safe and sound at the first stop on your tour. The mere mention of the VESPERS that you heard sung by the venerable monks has stirred in me the desire to hear the Lord praised in a similar fashion in Italy as well. The wait will be long, but I hope that I shall not die before tasting of its fruits. [...] Try to relax a bit. Please pay my respects by kissing the hand of Reverend Father Abbat on my behalf.”
