
Communion • 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C)

Optional verses from Psalm 80 (traditional numbering):



- Let there be no strange god among you, nor shall you worship a for-eign god.
 I am the Lord your God, who brought you up from the land of Egypt.
- But my people did not *heed* my voice, and Israel would not *o*-bey me.
 So I left them in their stubborn-*ness* of heart, to follow their *own* designs.
- 3. O that my peo-ple would heed me, that Israel would walk in my ways!At once I would sub-due their foes, turn my hand a-gainst their enemies.
