

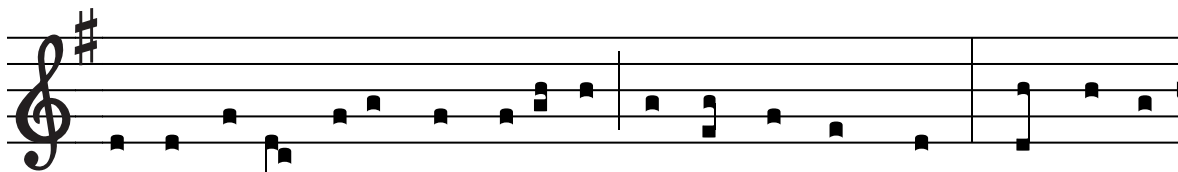

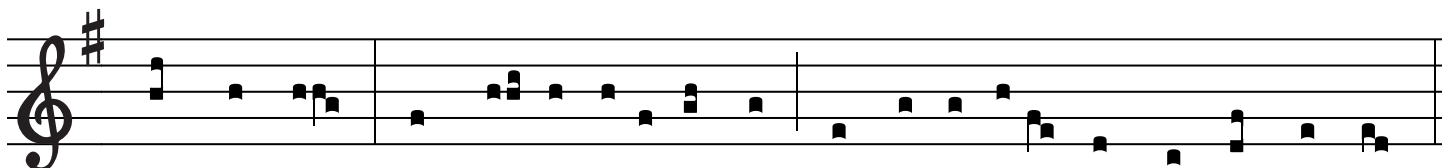

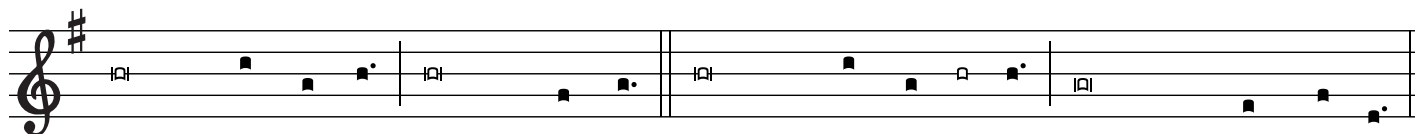


Y soul aspires after your salvation; I hope in your word. Soon be my

The following optional verses come from **Psalm 118** (*Traditional numbering*), just as the antiphon does :



It begins *with* part “A.” And here’s *part* “B.” Part “C” *re-peats* the first one. Part “D” *con-cludes* the tone.

1. Blessèd are those whose **way** is blame-less,
who walk in the law of **the** Lord!
Blessèd are those who keep **his** de-crees!
With all their **hearts** they seek him.
2. Forever **is** your word, O Lord,
standing firm in **the** heav-ens.
From age to age **is** your truth;
like the earth, **it** stands firm.
3. Your judgments endure **to** this day,
for all things are **your** ser-vants.
Had your law not been **my** de-light,
