



the ev - *er* - last-ing hills!

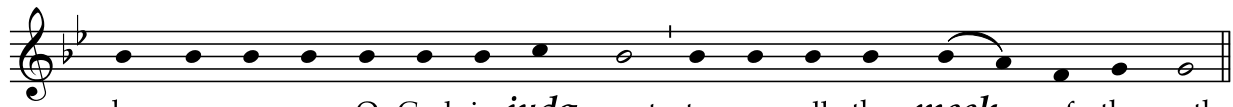
