Deus, in adjutórium meum inténde: Dómine, ad adjuvándum me festína: confundántur et revereántur inimíci mei, qui quærunt ánimam meam. y. Avertántur retrórsum et erubéscant: qui cógitant mihi mala. y. Glória Patri. NCLINE unto my aid, O God: O Lord, make haste to help me: let my enemies be confounded and ashamed, who seek my soul. (Ps 69: 4) Let them be turned backward and blush for shame, who desire evils to me. \(\frac{1}{3}\). Glory.
