

This is the traditional Introit that goes back 1,600+ years:

INTROIT. Ps 69: 2-3

Deus, in adiutorium meum intende:
Dómine, ad adjuvándum me festína:
confundántur et reveereántur inimí-
ci mei, qui quærunt ánimam meam.
ÿ. Avertántur retrórsum et erubéscant:
qui cógitant mihi mala. ÿ. Glória Patri.

INCLINE unto my aid, O God: O Lord, make haste to help me: **let my enemies be confounded and ashamed,** who seek my soul. (Ps 69: 4) **Let them be turned backward and blush for shame,** who desire evils to me. ÿ. Glory.

Notice what the “spoken” version bowdlerizes:

O God, come to my assistance;
O Lord, make haste to help me!
You are my rescuer, my help;
