

Broadly speaking, the French prefer to sing at a higher pitch than the Germans. This tradition goes back at least 150 years. That's why the modern notation version by Father Karl Weinmann frequently favors a lower pitch than the French version by Dom Lucien David. It's been said that Solesmes Abbey favors recitation on C-Natural, which some consider much too high.

The NOH notates this one at a lower key:

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Here are **the first three verses** of Number 272 in the *Saint Jean de Brébeuf Hymnal* (courtesy of SOPHIA INSTITUTE PRESS). Needless to say, the *Brébeuf Hymnal* contains all the verses—along with astounding translations, alternate melodies, color plates, and theological annotations—not just the first three:
