

This chart was assembled in 1868 by Abbat Pothier's younger brother (also a Benedictine monk) to demonstrate his elder brother's working practices.

The younger brother's name was Dom Alphonse Pothier. This chart belongs to the Abbey of Saint-Wandrille.

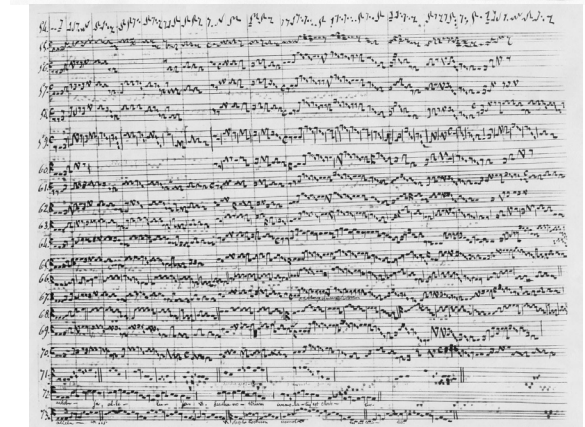
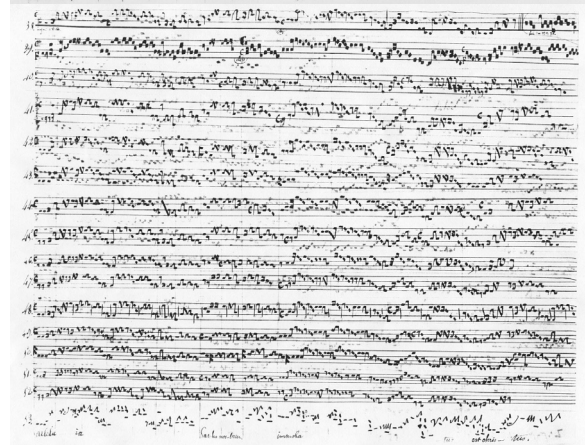
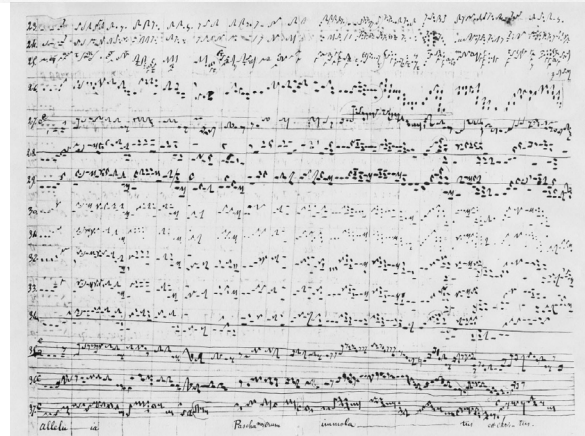
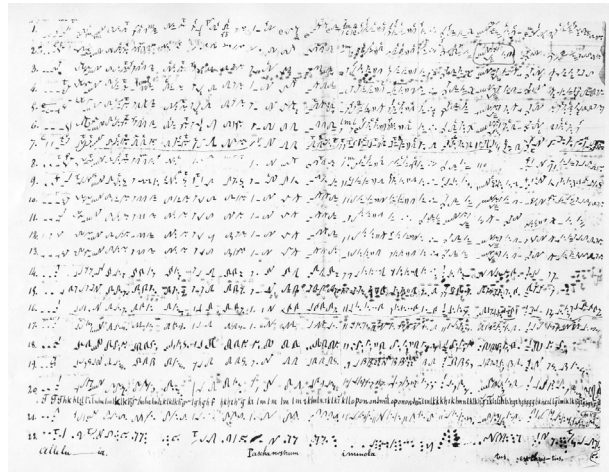
This chart was discovered by Jean-Pierre Noiseux and published in 2004 as part of an article he wrote for *Etudes Grégoriennes*.
