(i) It is incorrect to state that chords should be placed on tonic accents; on the contrary, chords should be placed on the ictus—otherwise there will be syncopation. On the other hand, it must be borne in mind that it is not desirable that each and every ictus should be underlined by a chord; the principal ones should be selected and these should be brought out in proportion to their importance in the whole architectural scheme of the phrase, of its greater rhythm.
