The Drogo Sacramentary was created circa 850AD. The sacramentary seems to have been for the personal use of Charlemagne's son Drogo, the Bishop of Metz. The beginning of the Roman Canon ("Te igitur clementissime...etc.") shows three Old Testament sacrifices: Abel, Abraham, and Melchizedek.
