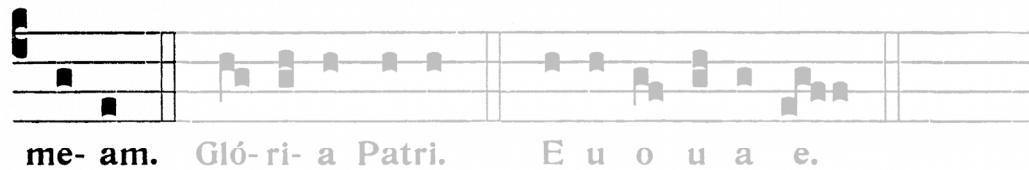
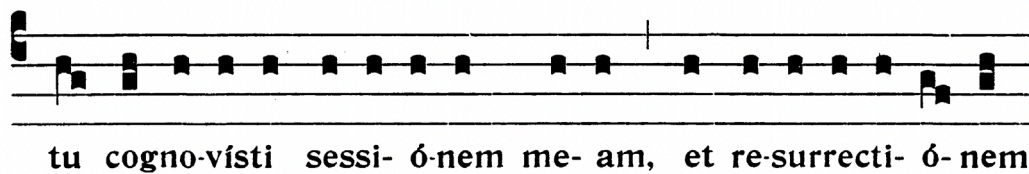
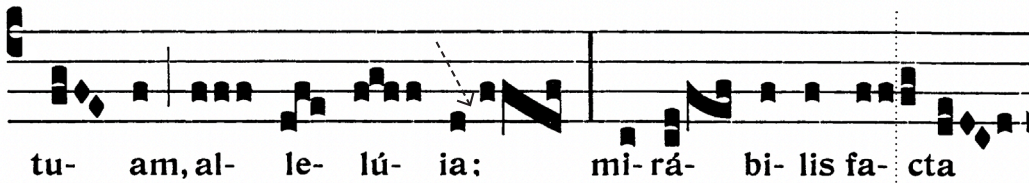


INTROIT • EASTER SUNDAY
