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This new "Parochial Hymnal" compiled and arranged by Rev. Carlo Rossini is offered as another step forward in perfecting the part taken by the congregation, both adults and children, in singing the praises of God, His Blessed Mother and the Saints. For its artistic qualities and practical usefulness the Parochial Hymnal is on the whole of a higher order than that which has heretofore appeared in print.

Included, besides a Mass and a Requiem for unison chorus are a liberal and carefully selected collection of Gregorian Chants, English and Latin hymns and material for the important feasts of the Ecclesiastical Year. The Gregorian Chants were selected from the Solesmes books which are officially approved by the Church. The accompaniments provided for the Chants are written according to the principles endorsed by the Pontifical Institute of Sacred Music at Rome as well as the Solesmes School itself.

The hymns in English, some of which date from the 12th century were selected for their beauty since they exert a special influence on the training of the young. In all cases the melodies provided are of a definite character but of a somewhat restricted range to meet the demands of unison singing by school children and the congregation. The accompaniments are both simple and appropriate and many suggestions are added to aid the less experienced organist in his part of the service.

Special attention has been given to the editing of the text to have it in keeping with Catholic thought and sentiment. At the same time a closer union of text and melody has been sought so that they correspond in expression and rhetorical pauses.

DECALOGUE OF THE ORGANIST AND THE CHURCH SINGER

1. The exclusive purpose of Music in church is the glory of God, the edification of the people, and the salvation of souls. Therefore all church music must be the very best of its kind, and also must be offered in the best possible way.
2. The organ in Catholic churches is not an instrument for noise or entertainment, but for the accompaniment and support of the singing.
3. The first requirement for a good rendition of church music is that the organist and the singers be permeated with the spirit which prompts Holy Mother Church during the different seasons of the Ecclesiastical Year (Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, Pentecost).
4. Organist and singers, in order to sing with the proper expression and to give God intelligent praise, should become familiar with the general meaning, at least, of the different verses of the Latin Hymns. The English translation of the latter may be found at the end of this book.
5. Reverence and devotion should always accompany the singing. School children and members of the Congregation, therefore should always sing between *mezzo-piano* and *mezzo-forte*, according to the general character of the hymns to be sung.
6. Congregational singing must retain the character of *choral* music. Consequently, no individual voice should be heard above the others; no personal ambition or desire to "show off" should be tolerated.
7. The singing should always proceed smoothly (*legato*). The tedious defect of producing a separate impulse of the voice for each note and syllable of the text should be carefully avoided. The contrary defect of "sliding," "slurring" and "scooping" should also be avoided.
8. The breathing marks and the expression marks, as they are found in the organ score and in the vocal part, should be scrupulously observed. Extra breathing, when necessary should be done between words, never between the syllables of a word.
9. Notes which in the melody are "repeated" (on account of two or more consecutive syllables on the same pitch) should not be repeated in playing the organ.
10. The Italian pronunciation of the Latin is prescribed by the Church. Therefore, singers should carefully enunciate both vowels and consonants according to this system: *a*=Ah; *e, ae, oe*= Short *ä*; *i*=ee; *o*=oh; *u*=oo; *j*=y, as in Yield; *c* before *e, i, y, ae, oe*=ch, as in Church; *g* before *e*, *i=j*, as in Joy; *gn* sounds as "ni" in Dominion; *t* followed by two vowels the first of which is *i*, is pronounced "tsi" (except when *t* is preceded by *s*; as in hostia, ostium.)—See next page

LITURGICAL PRONUNCIATION OF LATIN

The following rules are based on the actual pronunciation of Latin by the Clergy of the Province of Rome, and therefore are *absolutely reliable* notwithstanding any opinion to the contrary.

The "life" of the Roman-Latin pronunciation lies on the VOWELS. Each vowel has a different but never-changing sound:

A—always open as in *Father*.

E—as in *Red* but more resonant, more like *a* in *Fare* (never with a second sound as in *May*).

I and **Y**—as *ee* in *Feet* (never as *i* in *Tin*).

O—as in *For* (never as in *Go*).

U—as *oo* in *Moon* (never with a second sound as in *Issue*).

DIPHTHONGS:

AE and **OE**—as the above vowel **E**, except in words with the "diaeresis" as *Israël*, *Noë*, etc., where both vowels are pronounced.

AU—as *ou* in *House*. In singing, the first vowel is sustained for the entire length of the note; the second vowel is pronounced rapidly just before passing to the next syllable (*a-utem*, *la-udem*). The same rule holds for **EU** in the word *Éuge* (*é-uge*).

EI, **EO**, **EU** and **OU** are not diphthongs but "dissyllables"; therefore are to be pronounced as *two* separate vowels. The same rule holds for **UI** (*cu-i*, *hu-ic*) except when preceded by *q* (*qui*, *qui-dam*).

CONSONANTS:

C—before *e*, *i*, *y*, *ae*, *oe*, as *ch* in *Church*; in all other cases is like *K*.

G—before *e*, *i*, *y*, *ae*, *oe* is soft as in *Gentle*; in all other cases is hard as in *Govern*.

H—is mute, except in the words *Mihi* and *Nihil* where it is pronounced like *K* (*mi-ki*, *nikił*).

J—as *y* in *Yes* (Jesus: *Ye-sus*).

R—is pronounced by jarring the tongue against the palate (*or-bis*, *car-nis*).

X—as *ks*: *Lux*, *luks*; *Rex*, *reks*; *Dixit*, *di-kṣit*; *Eréxit*, *e-ré-ksit*; *Déxteram*, *déks-te-ram*; etc.

Z—as *dz* (not *ds*): *Názareth*, *Ná-dzareth*.

EX (alone) is pronounced *eks*. If *ex* is the beginning of a word: when combined with a Vowel, is pronounced *egs* (*Exáudi*, *egs-áu-di*; *Exémplum*, *e-gsém-plum*; *Exívit*, *egs-tí-vit*; etc.); when combined with a Consonant, is pronounced *eks*: *Excélsis*, *eks-chél-sis* (not *ek-shél-sis!*); *Exspécto*, *eks-pé-cto*; *Extra*, *eks-tra*; etc.

TI—when followed by a Vowel is like *tsi* (*Étiam*, *é-tsi-am*; *Patiéntia*, *pa-tsi-én-tsi-a*; *Póntio*, *Pón-tsi-o*); except when the *ti* is preceded by *s* (*Hóstia*, *ós-ti-a*; *Hóstium*, *ós-ti-um*): in this and all other cases is pronounced as ordinary *t* (*Petitiónen*, *pe-ti-tsi-ó-nem*).

TH—as simple *t* because *h* is mute: *Cathólicam*, *Ca-tó-li-cam*.

CH—always as *k*: *Chorus*, *ko-rus*; *Chérubim*, *ké-ru-bim*.

GN—has a liquid sound similar to that of *ni* in Dominions: *Agnus*, *A-nyus*; *Magnam*, *ma-nyam*; *Magníficat*, *ma-ny-fí-cat*.

SC—before *e*, *i*, *y*, *ae*, as *sh* in *Shell* (*Descén-dit*, *de-shén-dit*; *Súscipe*, *sú-shi-pe*; *Sciat*, *shi-at*): in all other cases is pronounced like *sk* (*Scriptúra*, *Skri-ptú-ra*; *Schola*, *sko-la*; *Scápulis*, *ská-pu-lis*).

Double consonants must actually be *doubled* in their intensity; thus: *Tollis*, *Peccáta*, *Hosánnā*, *Allelúia*: not *Tolis*, *Pecáta*, *Hosána*, *Alelúia*.—*Ecce*: as *ech-che*.

Dactylic words like *Glória*, *Fílium*, *Étiam*, *Grátiam*, etc., consist of *three* syllables which are to be pronounced *distinctly*: *Gló-ri-a*, *Fí-li-um*, *É-ti-am*, *Grá-ti-am* (not: *Gló-ria*, *Fí-lium*, *É-tiam*, *Grá-tiam*).

PRINCIPAL RULES FOR GOOD VOICE PRODUCTION

When singing, stand with heels about together.—Keep the head erect, the chest out, the abdomen in.—Keep the mouth open (round form), the teeth one inch apart, and the jaw relaxed (so, too, the muscles of the throat).—In breathing, inflate the lungs quietly and fully (without raising the shoulders), deflate the same easily and entirely.—Bring the tone *forward*, that is, do not permit the main stream of air to pass

through the nasal cavities (*nasal tone*) nor push it back to the root of the tongue (*throaty tone*).—Attack the note *straight-way* at the first breath, that is, without growling or humming.—Keep the tone in its proper pitch, without dropping or raising or trembling; to this effect avoid the extremes of *piano* and *forte*, and sing *mezzo-voce*.

ROGATION DAYS

(On April 25th, feast of Saint Mark; and on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday preceding the Ascension of Our Lord.)

The Procession takes place before the Mass—The Chanters, standing, sing first the Antiphon “Exsurge Domine,” then intone the LITANY OF THE SAINTS. Each invocation is to be sung *in full* by the Chanters (or by the Clergy) and repeated *in full* by Choir (or by the Congregation). At the invocation “Sancta Maria” all present stand, and the Procession begins. After the Litany, Psalm 69 is sung by the Clergy with the Choir alternating in singing the different Verses. Then the Celebrant sings the Versicles “Salvos fac, etc.” and the prescribed Orations with the Choir answering. The Mass has no “Gloria in excelsis” nor “Credo.” It ends with *V. Benedicamus Domino: R. Deo gratias.*

FORTY HOURS' ADORATION

FIRST DAY—The Procession takes place immediately after the Mass of Exposition. During the Procession the first *four* Stanzas of the PANGE LINGUA are sung (they may be repeated if necessary). Short Organ Interludes between Stanzas are permitted. After the Procession (when the Blessed Sacrament has been placed on the altar) the TANTUM ERGO is sung; *V. Panem de coelo etc.* is omitted, and the LITANY OF THE SAINTS is chanted at once, without the Antiphon “Exsurge Domine.” The Choir does not repeat the invocations but only answers “*Ora pro nobis*” etc.—After the Litany, Psalm 69 is sung by the Clergy, with the Choir alternating in singing the different Verses. Then the Celebrant sings the Versicles “Salvos fac, etc.” and the prescribed Orations, with the Choir answering.

SECOND DAY—The “Missa pro Pace” (Mass for Peace) is sung on a side altar, unless a feast of the First Class occurs on that day.—The “Missa pro Pace” is without *Gloria in excelsis*.

THIRD DAY—After the Mass of Reposition the LITANY OF THE SAINTS is chanted, together with the Psalm 69 and the Versicles “Salvos fac, etc.” to *V. Domine exaudi orationem meam* inclusive. Then the Blessed Sacrament is incensed and the Procession begins, during which the PANGE LINGUA is sung. As on the first day of Adoration, the TANTUM ERGO is sung after the Procession, when the Blessed Sacrament has been placed on the altar. Then the *V. Panem de coelo etc.* is intoned and the Celebrant sings the prescribed Orations, with the Choir answering.—BENEDICTION follows in the usual manner.

HOLY SATURDAY

After the blessing of the Baptismal Font, while the Procession returns to the Altar, the LITANY OF THE SAINTS is sung, with the omission of the invocations marked by the asterisk. Each invocation is to be sung *in full* by the Chanters and repeated *in full* by the Choir.—The *Kyrie eleison* and *Christe eleison*, at the end of the Litany, are omitted because of the “Kyrie” of the Mass which follows immediately. The Mass is without Introit, Credo, Offertory, Agnus Dei and Communion (see Page 38b).
