


Psalm 68 (67)

His anger lasts a moment; his favor all *through* **life**. * At night come tears, but *dawn brings* **joy**.


- 3. I said to myself in my *good* fortune: *

 - "What profit is my lifeblood, my going to *the* **grave**? *


 Can dust give you thanks, or pro*claim your* **faithf**ulness?"

Look towards him and be radiant; * 3. let your faces not be abashed.


> This lowly one called; the LORD heard, * and rescued him from all his distress.

- 3. It goes well for the man who deals generously and lends, * who conducts his affairs with justice.


He will nev*er be* **moved**; * forever shall the just *be re***mem**bered.
