O tremble before him, *all the earth*.

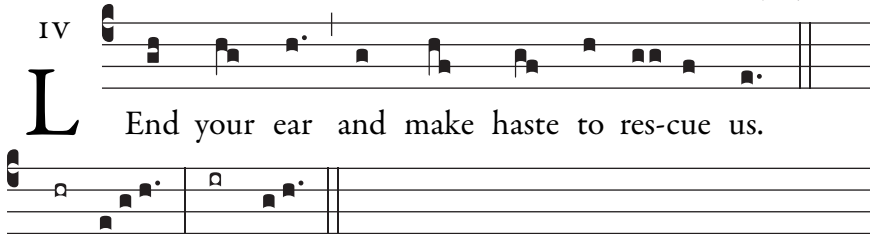
