Here, the Collect, proper to the Mass, is sung.



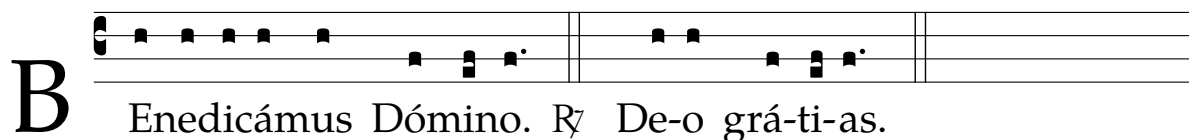
